

How to Transcribe The Atlantic Neptune

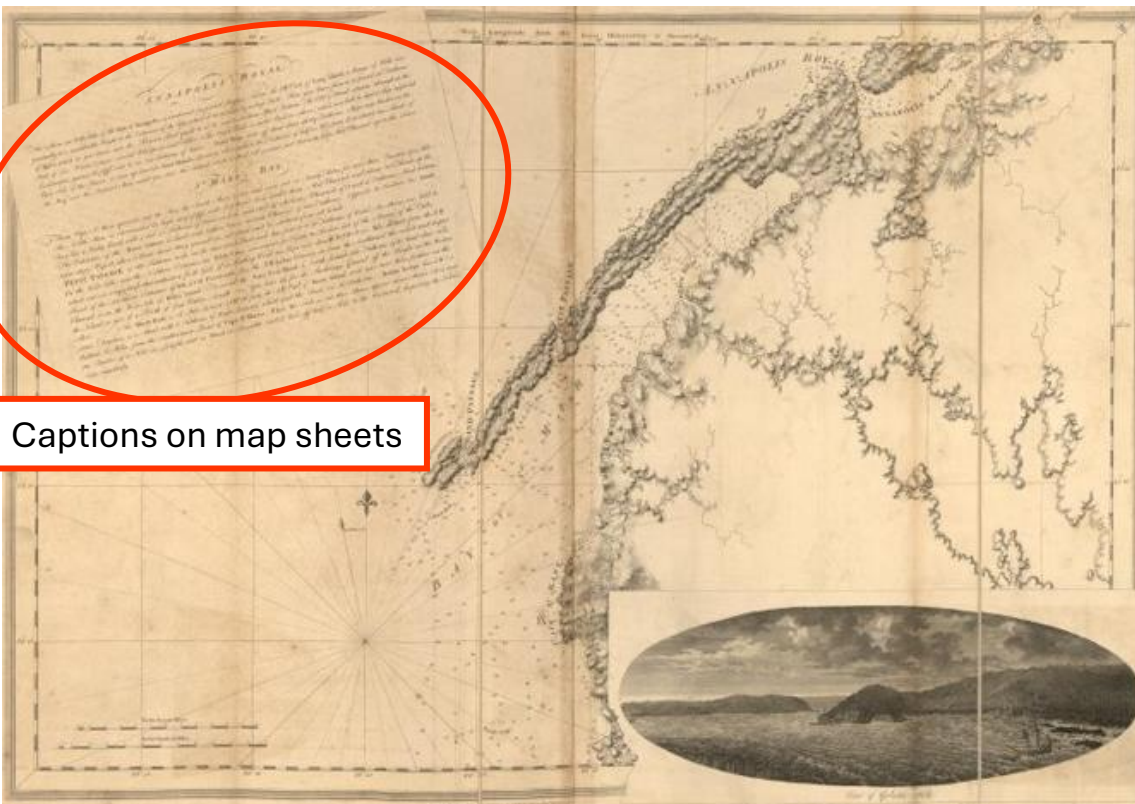
Goal: Capture non-map text to enable keyword search

Don't transcribe map labels identifying geographic features

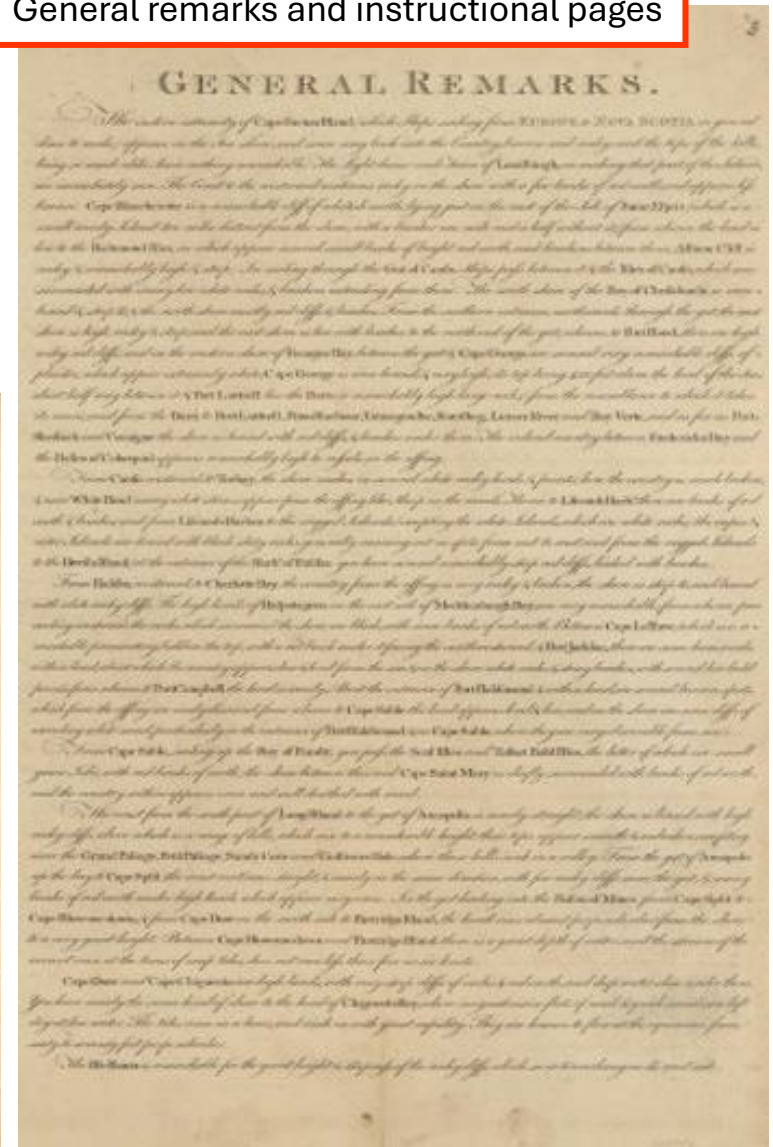
Do transcribe:

- Captions on the map sheets
- General remarks and instructional pages
- Captions of engraved images
- Text pages about map locations
- Town plan indexes
- Tide tables

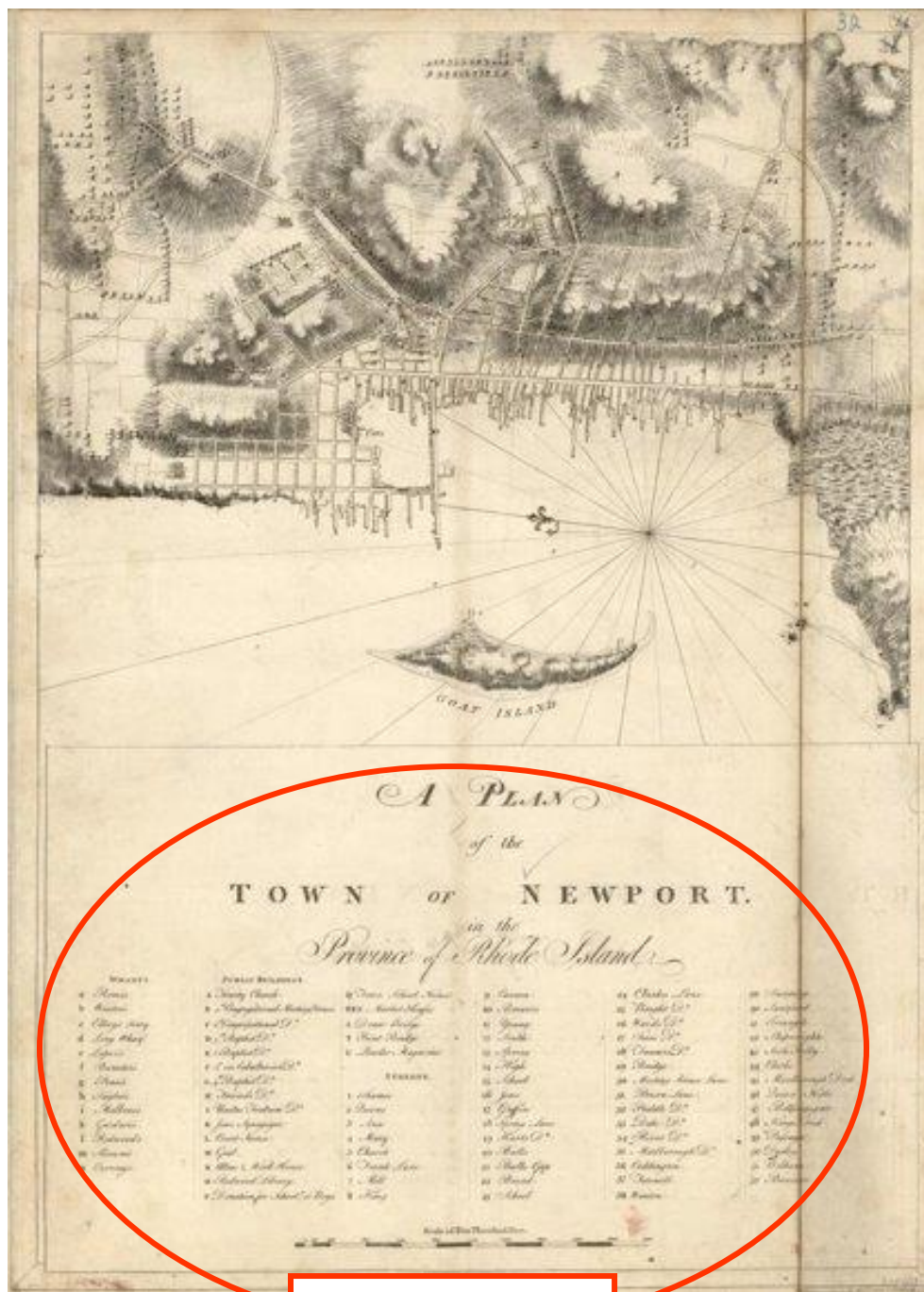
CANSO HARBOUR.

AT the Entrance of this Harbour, it flows, on the Days of New and full Moon till past eight o'Clock; and equinoctial Spring Tides rise 8 Feet perpendicular.

Sailing from the Westward into this Harbour, is soon as you have passed the *Running Ball*, which lies E, by S, distant one Mile from *Cape Cogh*, run for *Petipus Head* till you bring, as a thwart Mark, *Skeneval Head* and the North End of *Inner Isle* in one; then Steer West till you have *Burrying Isle* just open with *Stonewy Hill*, which is your leading Mark to run up until you come around *Burrying Isle*, Observing not to approach, nearer than 5 Fathom of Water, of its North End which is Shoal.

Coming from the Eastward, in Order to avoid the Sunken Rocks, extending one Mile South Easterly from *Gambury Isle*, continue your Course Westward until you open *East Island* with the West Point of *Gambury Isle*; then Steer up for *Petipus Head*, &c. as before.

The *Northwest Passage* (between *Blinney* and *Bukie* Isles) notwithstanding its narrowness, yet having depth of Water and a clear Channel is the best: In Sailing in, keep Midchannel between *Bold Rock* and *Mild Ledge* (dry at low Water.) About half a Cable Distance from the East Shore, near the South End of the Channel, lies a Sunken Rock, with 6 Feet of Water upon it.
